DAY 1 TALKING POINTS

- 59th Open Era edition of US Open starts on Sunday as four-time champion **Novak Djokovic** begins his 20th main draw appearance at this event, as he bids to become the first player in history to win 25 Grand Slam singles titles. Djokovic owns 37-0 career record in first two rounds at US Open and takes on World No. 49 **Mariano Navone** in their first meeting. Navone bids to become 1st man to oust Djokovic in Grand Slam 1R in over 20 years (Goldstein at 2006 Australian Open) and 2nd Argentine to defeat the Serb at a Grand Slam (Coria at 2005 Roland Garros).
- World No. 8 **Daniil Medvedev** faces qualifier **Hugo Gaston** as former champion aims to avoid back-to-back US Open losses to Frenchmen following his loss to Bonzi in 1R last year. Medvedev owns 33-8 record at this event, highlighted by 2021 title to deny Djokovic's calendar year Grand Slam in the final. Gaston attempts to record the biggest win of his career to reach US Open 2R for the second time after win over Shimabukuro in 2023.
- No. 20 seed **Tommy Paul** is one of six American men scheduled to play on Day 1 with 29-year-old facing qualifier **Coleman Wong**. Paul aims to pass his opening hurdle at US Open for the 5th consecutive year and start his campaign to become the only active American man to complete the set of QF at all 4 Grand Slam events. Wong, who made history for Hong Kong after run to US Open 3R last year, seeks fourth Top 30 win of his career.
- Wildcard **J.J. Wolf** takes a 2-1 **Lexus ATP Head2Head** lead into his encounter vs. World No. 16 **Alexander Bublik**, as Cincinnati-native looks for his first tour-level win in over two years after struggles with shoulder injury. 27-year-old American also aims to reach US Open 2R for the third time, first since 2022. Bublik, who recorded his best US Open result by reaching 4R last year, looks to pass his opening round at 3rd of 4 Grand Slams this year.
- Last year's quarter-finalist and No. 18 seed **Jiri Lehecka** meets two-time US Open semi-finalist **Pablo Carreno Busta** for the second time at Grand Slam level this year after 35-year-old Spaniard upset then-No. 12 seed in Roland Garros 1R in May. Lehecka now looks to record his 100th tour-level win on hard courts, while Carreno Busta aims to reach US Open 2R for the tenth time in 12 career appearances.
- 2020 quarter-finalist **Denis Shapovalov** leads his first-round opponent, **Miomir Kecmanovic**, 5-0 in their **Lexus ATP Head2Head**. Shapovalov, who is making his ninth main draw appearance at this event, aims to reach the second round for the eighth time, while Kecmanovic looks to pass the first round at this event for the fifth time.
- In other American action, **Jenson Brooksby** takes on **Jamie Faria**, as he bids to avenge the Cincinnati 1R loss to the Portuguese No. 2 two weeks ago, while **Alex Michelsen**, who turned 22 on Tuesday, takes on 19-year-old qualifier **Federico Cina**. Wildcards 22-year-old **Sebastian Gorzny** and 18-year-old **Jack Kennedy** both look for first tour-level wins of their respective careers. Kennedy meets qualifier **Lloyd Harris** and bids to become the youngest American to win a Grand Slam match since Young, 18, at 2007 US Open and 2nd man born in 2008 or later to win a Grand Slam match after Kouame, born in 2009, advanced to Roland Garros 3R earlier this season.

DANIIL MEDVEDEV

US Open Stats

- > The 2021 US Open champion is making his 10th consecutive appearance (2017-2026).
- > Top 8 seed at US Open for the seventh time in last 8 editions (since 2019) after being seeded No. 13 last year.
- > Won 1st Grand Slam title and denied No. 1 Djokovic calendar Grand Slam by beating the Serb 6-4 6-4 6-4 in 2021 final.
- > Became 2nd men's player since Lendl in 1987 to lose 1 set en route to US Open title (also Nadal in 2010).
- > Advanced to 1st Grand Slam final at 2019 US Open, rallying from 2 sets down vs. No. 2 Nadal before falling in 5 sets.
- > Reached 3rd US Open final in 2023, earning 2nd win over a World No. 1 at US Open, defeating Alcaraz in SF.
- > Boasts a 33-8 record at US Open (.805) – his most wins and highest win percentage at a Grand Slam tournament.
- > Leads all players on ATP Tour since 2018 in hard-court finals (36) and wins (325) and is tied with Djokovic for 2nd-most titles on this surface (21), behind Sinner (23).
- > Reached US Open 4R or better for 6 straight years (2019 Final, 2020 SF, 2021 Title, 2022 4R, 2023 Final, 2024 QF) and became first man born in 1990s to reach 5 US Open quarter-finals.
- > Went 1-3 during North American summer hard-court swing, losing in opening rounds of Montreal to van de Zandschulp and Winston-Salem last week to Damm and beat Trungelliti in Cincinnati before losing to Nakashima after holding 3 MPs.
- > Owns 5-3 record at Grand Slams this year, advancing to Australian Open 4R (I. Tien) and Wimbledon 3R (I. Struff), but suffered opening round loss in Roland Garros 1R to Walton.
- > He is 7-2 in US Open opening rounds and 24-2 vs. players outside Top 30 at this event, losing to No. 69 Shapovalov in main draw debut in 2017 1R and No. 51 Bonzi in 1R last year.

Career Highlights

- > Spent 16 weeks as World No. 1 in 2022, becoming tallest No. 1 in history at 1.98m (6'6") and 1st No. 1 other than Djokovic, Federer, Murray and Nadal since Roddick in 2004.
- > Six-time Grand Slam finalist owns 5-3 record vs. Djokovic when Serb is World No. 1, including 6-4 6-4 6-4 win in 2021 US Open final that denied Djokovic calendar Grand Slam.
- > Beat No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Nadal and No. 3 Thiem en route to 2020 Nitto ATP Finals title, becoming 1st player to sweep Top 3 in tournament history and anywhere on ATP Tour since 2007 Madrid (Nalbandian).

- > Earned 20 straight wins from 2020-21 (12 vs. Top 10), led ATP Tour with 63 victories in 2021, and captured team titles at 2021 ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.
- > Won 21 of his 23 singles titles on hard courts, including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2019 Cincinnati, 2019 Shanghai, 2020 Paris, 2021 Toronto, 2023 Miami before winning 2023 Rome, his 1st title on clay and captured first 22 titles at 22 different events, before winning his second Dubai title in 2026.

HUGO GASTON

US Open Stats

- > Making fifth consecutive US Open main draw appearance, coming from qualifying for the second time (also 2023), defeating Justo in Q1, Ilagan in Q2 and coming from a set down to defeat C. Smith in Q3 this year.
- > Aims to advance to US Open 2R for the second time after defeating No. 158 Shimabukuro in 2023 1R, before loss to Djere.
- > Suffered opening round losses to No. 47 Bublik in 2022, No. 64 Diaz Acosta in 2024 and No. 112 Mochizuki last year.
- > Played US Open boys' singles in 2017, losing to Tajima in 2R, and 2018, losing to Nakashima in 3R.
- > Owns 1-3 Grand Slam record this season, advancing to Roland Garros 2R after defeating countryman Monfils and lost to F. Cerundolo in 2R. Lost to No. 2 Sinner in Aus. Open 1R and No. 87 Tsitsipas in Wimbledon 1R as Q.
- > He is 1-5 vs. Top 10 (d. No. 9 de Minaur at 2024 Antwerp) and bids to be the second Frenchman to earn a Top 10 win at US Open in this decade after Mannarino defeated No. 6 Shelton via RET in 3R last year.
- > 25-year-old is 0-2 vs. Top 10 at Grand Slams, but earned Top 20 wins over No. 17 Wawrinka in 2020 Roland Garros 3R and No. 20 de Minaur in 2022 Roland Garros 1R.

Career Highlights

- > Broke into Top 100 after reaching 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Paris QF as Q and achieved career-high No. 58 in July 2022.
- > Advanced to 1st ATP Tour QF, SF and final at 2021 Gstaad as World No. 155 and competed at Next Gen ATP Finals to end season.
- > Saved 2 MPs to beat defending champion Baez en route to 2nd ATP Tour final at 2024 Kitzbuhel and defeated No. 9 de Minaur for biggest win of career at 2024 Antwerp.
- > At 2020 Roland Garros, became 1st Frenchman to reach 4R in tournament debut since Dominguez in 1971, defeating 2015 champion Wawrinka in 5 sets before falling in 5 sets to 2-time finalist Thiem.
- > As 239th-ranked WC, became lowest-ranked player to reach Grand Slam 4R since No. 248 Canas at 2004 Australian Open and Roland Garros 4R since No. 283 Di Pasquale in 2002.
- > Ended 2018 as World No. 2 junior after winning gold medal in boys' singles and bronze medal in both boys' doubles and mixed doubles at Youth Olympics.

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MARIANO NAVONE

US Open Stats

- > Making his third consecutive US Open main draw appearance after losing in qualifying in 2023.
- > Defeated No. 89 Altmaier in 2024 1R for his only win at the event, before losing to No. 184 Evans in 2R and to No. 55 Giron in five sets in 1R last year.
- > He is 1-6 vs. Top 10, defeating No. 5 Auger-Aliassime in ATP Masters 1000 Rome 2R earlier this season and seeks first Top 20 win at a Grand Slam (0-2; d. No. 30 Shapovalov in 2025 Wimbledon 1R).
- > Aims to advance to Grand Slam 2R for the second time this season (1-3), defeating No. 63 Brooksby in Roland Garros 1R, losing to eventual semi-finalist Mensik in 2R (13-11 in final set tiebreak).
- > Bids to be first Argentine to earn Top 10 win at US Open since Schwartzman defeated No. 6 Zverev in 2019 4R and second to defeat Djokovic at a Grand Slam after No. 9 G. Coria defeated then-No. 153 qualifier Djokovic in 2005 Roland Garros 2R.

Career Highlights

- > Broke into Top 200 in June 2023, Top 100 in February 2024 and Top 50 in April 2024, achieving career-high No. 29 in June 2024 after capturing 6th Challenger title in Cagliari.
- > As No. 31 seed at 2024 Roland Garros, became first man in Open Era to be seeded in his Grand Slam main draw debut and defeated former-World No. 10 Carreno Busta in 1R.
- > Captured 1st ATP Tour title at 2026 Bucharest, earning deciding set wins in 3 out of 5 matches and saving 2 match points vs. van de Zandschulp in SF and defeated No. 5 Auger-Aliassime to reach 1st ATP Masters 1000 3R at 2026 Rome.
- > Earned 1st ATP Tour win and advanced to 1st QF, SF and final at 2024 Rio de Janeiro as Q and defeated clay-court champions Darderi, Seyboth Wild and F. Cerundolo en route to 2nd final at 2024 Bucharest.
- > On home soil, made his ATP Tour debut at 2024 Cordoba as WC and earned 1st Top 20 win over No. 12 Rune to reach 2025 Buenos Aires QF before squandering 2 MPs vs. eventual champion Fonseca.
- > Posted 40-18 Challenger record in 2023, ending the season on a 19-2 run and led all players with 5 Challenger titles, winning in Poznan, Santa Fe, Santa Cruz, Buenos Aires and Santa Fe-2.

NOVAK DJOKOVIC

US Open Stats

- > Making 20th US Open appearance since debut in 2005, only missing tournament twice since (2017, 2022). Owns 4-6 record in US Open finals and in 2023 became the oldest US Open champion in Open Era.
- > He is 19-0 in US Open 1R matches, earliest exits in 1st two appearances in 2005-06 3R and two years ago (2024 3R).
- > Looks for sole all-time record for most Grand Slam titles (25) and to tie Connors, Federer and Sampras for most US Open men's singles titles in Open Era (5).
- > Avenged 2021 final loss to Medvedev in 2023 final, winning in straight sets. Only lost two sets all event to Djere in 3R, rallying from two sets down for the 8th time in career.
- > In 2021, lost to Medvedev in final 6-4 6-4 6-4, falling short of becoming 1st man to win a singles calendar Grand Slam since Rod Laver in 1969.
- > Owns Open Era record for most US Open men's singles finals (Djokovic 10, Lendl 8, Sampras 8, Connors 7, Federer 7).
- > En route to 2021 final, he posted wins after losing opening set against Nishikori in 3R, [WC] Brooksby in 4R, [6] Berrettini in QF and [4] A. Zverev in SF. Entered 2021 season with 31-36 Grand Slam record after losing 1st set (went 10-1 in 2021 Grand Slam tournaments). It marked 1st time in his career in any tournament he posted 4 wins from a set down.
- > Captured US Open titles in 2011 (d. No. 2 Nadal), 2015 (d. No. 2 Federer), 2018 (d. No. 3 Del Potro) and 2023 (d. No. 3 Medvedev). Saved 2 match points and rallied from 2 sets down vs. Federer in 2011 SF en route to 1st US Open title.
- > Winner of 95 US Open matches – 2nd in Open Era (Connors 98, Djokovic 95, Federer 89, Agassi 79, Lendl 73).
- > Owns 81-2 record in Grand Slam opening rounds after 3-2 start, winning 78 in a row since losing to Goldstein in 2006 Australian Open 1R and is 56-1 vs. players outside Top 30 at US Open (l. to No. 48 Verdasco in 2005 3R).

> Owns 22-1 record vs. Argentines since the start of 2017 season, lone loss to Tirante in ATP Masters 1000 Cincinnati 2R earlier this month and 19-1 vs. Argentines at Grand Slams (after 0-1 start), including 7-0 at US Open.

Career Highlights

> Record 7-time Nitto ATP Finals champion owns ATP/WTB record for most weeks at No. 1 (428), as well as PIF ATP Rankings records for most years ended at No. 1 (8) and most wins vs. Top 10 (266), finishing in Top 5 in 17 of last 19 years (2017 – No. 12, 2024 – No. 7).

> All-time leader for most Grand Slam men's singles titles in history (24), including record 10 Australian Open titles, and is 1 of 3 men to hold all 4 Grand Slam championships at same time (also Budge, Laver).

> Only player to win all 9 ATP Masters 1000 events since start of series in 1990, doing so multiple times for a record total of 40 titles.

> Owns most Grand Slam match wins in history (409), 3rd-most men's singles titles in Open Era (101) and 3rd-most men's singles wins in Open Era (1,177).

> Earned gold medal at 2024 Paris Olympics, joining Agassi and Nadal as only men to win all 4 Grand Slam titles and Olympic title in singles.

> Boasts winning records against both Federer (27-23) and Nadal (31-29), as well as win streaks of ATP Tour-record 43 matches (2010-11) and Open Era-record 30 Grand Slam matches (2015-16).

COLEMAN WONG

US Open Stats

- > Playing in US Open main draw for the second consecutive year after qualifying last year to become the first man representing Hong Kong to enter a Grand Slam main draw in the Open Era and second in tournament history (Ip in 1947).
- > Rallied from a set down to defeat Moller in Q1 this year before straight sets wins over Neumayer and Lajovic.
- > Last year, came from qualifying and earned wins over No. 71 Kovacevic and No. 85 Walton before losing in 5 sets to No. 15 Rublev in 3R.
- > Making his third Grand Slam main draw appearance, also entering 2026 Roland Garros as LL, losing to Blockx in 1R.
- > Claimed 2021 US Open boys' doubles title w/Westphal and advanced to 2022 boys' singles semi-finals, l. to Bailly.
- > Bids to be lowest-ranked man to defeat Paul since No. 165 Ofner in Wimbledon 2R last year.
